Elizabeth II became the Queen of the United Kingdom on 6th February 1952, upon the death of her Father, George VI. She was just 25 years old. The Coronation took place on 2nd June 1953, and was watched by more than 20 million people on television. The Coronation brought the nation together, there were street parties across the country. 70 years later, people came together again, as street parties and community events took place, when The Queen became the first ever monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee. In the same year of 2022, on 8th September, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, died peacefully at her Scottish home, Balmoral.

Throughout her 70 year reign, The Queen has overseen enormous social change, yet she has been our constant.

We would like to express our condolences, and deepest sympathy to the Royal Family on the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. The Royal book of Condolence has been signed online, on behalf of our Ablewell family. Further support is being offered to those wishing to leave their own personal message of condolence.

Since the news of her death, people have travelled to Buckingham Palace, and other Royal Houses, to pay tribute to The Queen. Floral tributes have also been laid on war memorials, and in certain public spaces in their local towns. Football has been cancelled, whilst other events, have shown respect by holding periods of silence and remembrance.
